You'd think a travel agent dreamed of Coorg. Also known as Kodagu, this in the Western Ghats of south-western karnataka can be pictured thus: 1,593 square miles of undulating topography carpeted in green, often covered by thin white mist. Bamboo, sandalwood, rosewood forests. Streams and rivulets, children of the river Cauvery, wending their way through the land. Cofee bushes with red berries.Pepper, cardamom, oranges, nutmeg, turmeric, lemon grass......a land fecund beyond belief. Madikeri, or Mercara, is the main town of Coorg. Its famous Madikeri Fort was originally a mud structure, which Tipu Sultan rebuilt with stone. Raja's Seat, One kilmetre from the bus station, was where the Kodagu kings would traditionally view sunrises and sunsets. Abbi Falls is a beautiful waterfall, 5 km away. Omkareshwara Temple was built by the Kodagu king Ligaraja in 1820. The temple is remarkable for its mosque-like style. The Madikeri area is a trekker's paradise-up and down hills, through coffee and pepper plantations, alongside the graceful Cauvery and myriad little streams. The Coorg Wildlife society, based in Madikeri, promotes wildlife and environmental conservation and also organizes treks to Pushpagiri and Brahmagiri Sanctuary.
